Thanks to your incredible generosity, we launched several new initiatives in 2024 focused on planter care, planter development, and project management. Each of these areas will continue to grow as we build momentum into 2025.

We were also overwhelmed by the gift of two new churches your support helped bring to life in 2024: Generations Church in Eugene, OR, and Onechurch in Seattle, WA. Both are already averaging more than 600 people each week, with a significant number of 20-somethings filling the rooms. It's been amazing to witness what God is doing through these communities.

But the most powerful new beginnings in 2024? Over 100 people were baptized across these two churches—new brothers and sisters in Christ. What a beautiful reminder that your support is making a real and lasting difference in the Pacific Northwest!

GENERATIONS

Generations Church in Eugene, Oregon celebrated its grand opening worship service on January 21, 2024—drawing over 480 people despite a brutal ice storm. Since then, the church has grown into a vibrant, multi-generational community, with attendees ranging in age from 8 months to 80 years. As momentum continued to build, 80 years. As momentum continued to build, Generations added a second Sunday service to accommodate rising attendance, which surpassed 600 by the end of 2024. This remarkable growth speaks to a deep hunger in this university town for authentic relationships and gospel-centered teaching.

Alongside the church launch, Generations also established Salt Co., a college ministry on the University of Oregon campus. In 2024, the ministry averaged more than 250 students each week, with over 325 attending the Fall Kickoff at McArthur Court this past October. Salt Co. has quickly become a vital bridge between the university and the church.

Generations is deeply committed to reaching college students with the gospel and believes that true discipleship flourishes in a multi-generational setting. With thousands of students arriving in Eugene each year, the church's vision remains clear: to be a place where one generation declares God's works to the next—seeing real life change and lasting impact across the university and the wider community.

ONECHURCH

In September 2024, Filmore and Caitlin Bouldes and their team launched Onechurch in the heart of Seattle's International District, following a year of prayer, preparation, and a clear sense of calling. After nearly a decade of pastoral ministry in New York City, the couple returned to Caitlin's hometown with a vision to plant a church that would reflect the beauty of heaven and bring the hope of Jesus to a city often marked by spiritual disconnection. Despite Seattle's reputation for being one of the most secular cities in the U.S., the Bouldes believed God had a greater story in store—one where lives would be transformed, relationships deepened, and the gospel made tangible through a vibrant, welcoming community.

The church's first public worship service drew 488 attendees, and by their second Sunday, 26 people had been baptized—an early sign of the spiritual hunger and revival that Filmore and Caitlin had been praying for. By year's end, the church was averaging over 600 weekly attendees, anchored by a passionate core team of more than 150 people who are actively discipling newcomers through city-wide dinner parties. As one of only a few churches in Seattle's International District, Onechurch is uniquely positioned to serve a beautifully diverse group of 20-somethings and beyond.

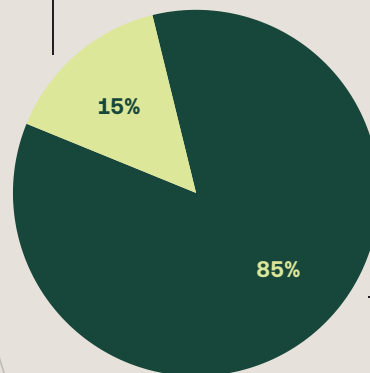

COMING TO CALDWELL, ID

Located in the heart of the Treasure Valley, Caldwell, ID is a growing city with a rich agricultural history and a vibrant community. Nearly 40% of Caldwell's population is Latino, contributing deeply to the city's culture, economy, and faith landscape. Mario and Jamie Romero have been discipling their initial house community for about 9 months. In January of 2025, United Church plans to add additional house churches to their new micro-church community and hold their first collective gathering.

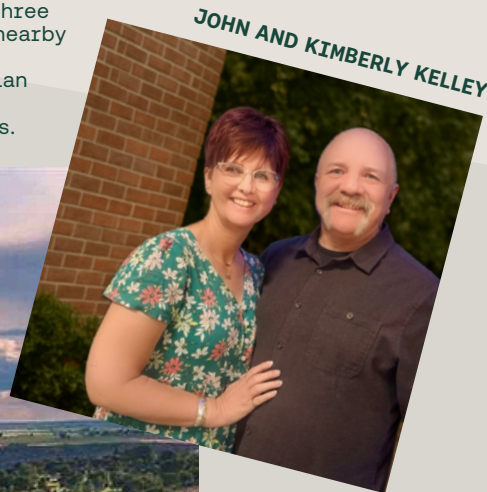
COMING TO SEATAC, WA

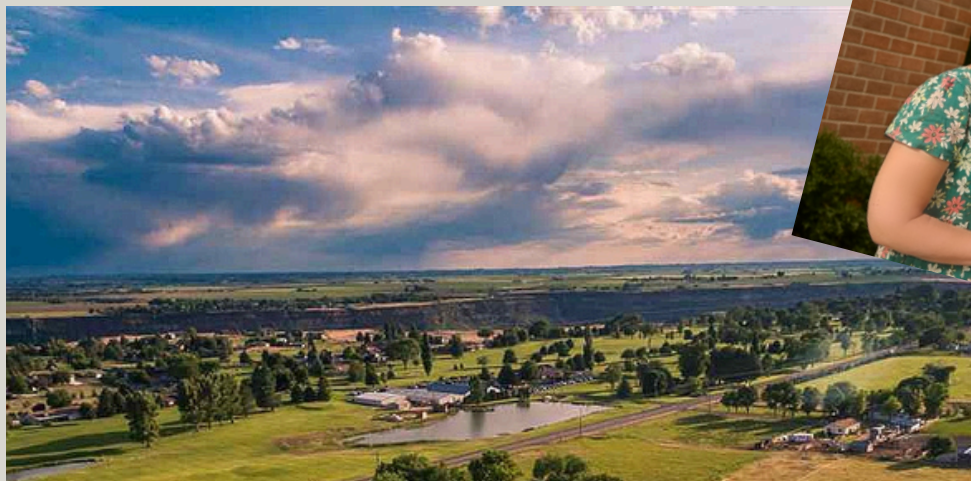


COMING TO NW JEROME, ID
